

Trumpets - 1936 to 1952

Foster Reynolds (1883-1960) (photo 1) left White later this year and incorporated as the Foster A. Reynolds Co., #2837-2853 Prospect Ave SE, with a ten-year lease on a modern brick factory (photo 2). The Ohio Band Instrument Co, a subsidiary, operated in the same location. Production started in early 1936 with twenty workers (*Cleveland Plain Dealer*). Ohio used the Regent model name.
